A WORD OF ADVICE: We use folding chairs in our classrooms. If you have back issues, it would probably be a good idea to bring cushions to make your experience more enjoyable.

Unless otherwise stated, please purchase the items required for the class BEFORE the class. The instructor must start the class on time and cannot wait for you to shop. Please make your purchases during store hours, 10am – 5:30pm, M, T, W, F, Sat., 10am – 8pm on Thursdays. **After-hours purchases may be made ONLY by filling out a form and including credit card information.**

A NOTE ABOUT THE KNITTER'S TOOL KIT:

All knitting students should come to class with the appropriate tools. The tools required for each class will vary. As students progress from beginner to advanced knitters, the number and variety of tools required will increase. Below please find suggested tools for the beginning knitter and the intermediate and above knitter:

- Yarn – **No single-ply yarns!** 2 – 3 oz light-colored worsted-weight yarn **wound as a center-pull ball.**
 - About 1 oz of the same weight of yarn as the yarn above, of a contrasting color for accent (red was traditional, but whatever you like is fine).
 - Needles – One set of 7" long (approximately) double-pointed needles, size 6.
 - Crochet Hook – size D or E
 - Your knitting tool kit – must include, among other items, a tapestry needle, stitch markers, cotton waste yarn for holding stitches, magnetic board or sticky notes or highlighter tape for keeping your place on the chart.
 - A cushion for your chair.
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Class Title: **2-AT-A-TIME SOCKS**

Homework/Materials required:

- Required Text: *2-at-a-Time Socks* by Melissa Morgan-Oakes
 - 2 balls of Valley Yarns Superwash in two different colors. The colors do not need to be the same as those in the book, but one should be darker than the other.
 - 1 US 4, 40" long circular needle
 - Your knitting tool kit
 - A cushion for your chair
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Class Title: **MITTENS AND SOCKS FROM MEASUREMENTS**

Date and Time: Tuesday, September 29, October 6, 13, 27, November 3, 10 from 6pm – 8pm

Homework/Materials required:

Note: The mittens and socks must be made to the measurements of the person knitting them.

- If you have never knit either mittens or socks before, please choose a worsted weight yarn. It is much easier to learn the techniques on a heavier weight yarn because you can see the stitches better. You will need approximately 240 yards for the mittens and 480 yards for the socks. If you have stash, use it. You will need to get a gauge of 5.5 or 6 sts per inch on the worsted, so a set of double-pointed needles in size 5 or 6 is appropriate as sock fabric must be dense. This is only a recommendation; you may need another size, depending on how you knit.
- If you have knit mittens and socks before, feel free to use any weight yarn you wish. Please check with the sales associates for approximate yardage needed for the yarn you choose. If you have stash, use it. Bring double-pointed needles in sizes which will produce a dense fabric, usually 3 or 4 sizes smaller than what is recommended for regular knitting.

Class Title: **TOE-UP SOCKS**

Date and Time: Wednesday, November 4, 11, 18, December 2 from 10am – 12pm

Homework/Materials required:

- For the ease of learning the Toe-Up techniques, please use a dk weight or light worsted weight yarn, and needles as below. You will also need a few stitch markers.
 - sport/dk worsted

125 yds	100yds	Babies
200	175	Child's sm.
250	200	Child's med.
350	300	Women
400	300	Men

 - Needles. One (or two) set(s) of double pointed needles in the size that you decide upon after making a gauge swatch. For a denser sock fabric you may want to use a needle sized smaller than recommended on the yarn label.
 - **Homework: Gauge swatch.** This pattern is based on the gauge you choose while making your gauge swatch. It is important to make your swatch in the round on dpns using about 30 to 40 stitches in stockinette stitch. After knitting in the round for 3-4 inches in height, you can lie the piece folded flat and measure in 3 or 4 different places. If your stitches are too loose or tight, continue your swatch on smaller or larger needles for another 2 inches, etc., until you get a fabric you like for a sock. Then measure your gauge accurately, including fractions of a stitch.

- Yarn – 440yds sock yarn of your choice
- Hooks – sizes F and E
- Your crochet tool kit.

Class Title: **PLEATED BALLET FLATS**

Instructor: Tina McElmoyl

Date and Time: Sunday, November 1 from 10am to 1:30pm

Homework/Materials required:

- Yarn – 2 skeins Debbie Bliss Cashmerino Chunky (or equivalent)
- Needles – two sets of 24” or longer circular needles size 7 or size needed to obtain gauge and two size 7 or smaller dpns
- Stitch holders or cotton scrap yarn
- Gauge – 17 sts over 4” in St st using size 7 needles. This is smaller than the recommended gauge for the yarn.
- Your knitting tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.

Homework:

- Check your gauge. You will be knitting the yarn a bit more densely than recommended by the yarn manufacturer.
 - Knit the sole of the slipper. Women’s shoe size 5-6(7-8, 9, 10, 11).
 - Cast on 6 sts and work back and forth on one circular needle using garter st for 2 rows.
 - In rows 3 and 5, inc 1 st each end as follows: kf&b, k to last 2 sts, kf&b, k1 (10 sts).
 - Row 4 and all subsequent rows up to dec row: Continue in garter and, counting the ridges rather than the rows, repeat inc rows when you have 18/24 ridges (14 sts). Note: When counting ridges, do not count the CO edge as a ridge.
 - Continue in garter st and when you have 32(34, 36, 38, 40) ridges, work dec as follows: k1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Repeat this dec at 34 (36, 38, 40, 42), 36(38, 40, 42, 44) and 37(39, 41, 43, 45) ridges. Note: The sole should measure approx. 8.5(9, 9.5, 10, 10.5) inches, allowing ¼ “ for stretching. If you want to knit one more ¼ “ knit one more row.
 - Leave live sts on the needle and bring to class.
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Class Title: **CROCHETED MARY JANE SLIPPERS**

Homework/Materials required:

- Yarn – 150 yards main color worsted weight yarn
- 50 yards contrast color worsted weight yarn
- Hooks – G and F
- Tapestry needle
- Buttons – two ½” to 1” buttons of your choice to coordinate with yarn
- Your crochet tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.
- **Homework:** Please work up a 4 x 4” square in double crochet with your main color using your G hook. This is important and will save you time when we begin the class.

Class Title: **KNIT ONE BELOW SOCKS**

Homework/Materials required:

- Yarn – approximately 400 yards any sock weight yarn of your choice. If you’d like to use 2 yarns, they can both be contrasting solid colors, 2 variegated yarns, or 1 variegated and 1 solid color yarn. For the 2 yarn option, you’ll need approximately 200 yards of each yarn.
- Needles – one set of five dpns in size 1 or size to obtain gauge of 5 sts per inch.
- Your knitting tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.

Class Title: **FIRST CARDIGAN**

Instructor: Pixie Benoist

Date and Time: Wednesday, October 7, 28, November 4, 11, December 2, 16 from 3pm to 5pm

Homework/Materials required:

- **Four 4” x 4”** swatches in stockinette in any plain, light-colored, worsted weight yarn – blocked. Use yarn from your stash if you have the right kind. Do not use your sweater yarn. Do not add borders to the swatches. Two of the swatches should start with an inch and a half of 2 x 2 ribbing; be sure to cast on a multiple of 4 + 2 stitches (for example, 4 x 4 = 16 + 2 = 18). Bind off 3 of the swatches...if you are a tight knitter, use a larger needle for the bind-off. Leave the 4th swatch on spare needles or a piece of scrap cotton yarn. These swatches will be used for practicing seaming and other techniques. These swatches are not your gauge swatch. **BRING SWATCHES TO THE FIRST CLASS.**
- **Buttons** – to be chosen before you knit the buttonhole band.
- **Pattern** is provided. Please bring a sweater that fits you well; we will take measurements from that sweater to decide on the size you will make.
- Worsted weight yarn that will knit to a gauge of **4 ½ sts to the inch** and needles that will get you that gauge.
- Bring to class the **needles** recommended by your yarn as well as a size smaller and larger. We will be making a gauge swatch at the first class; do not make the gauge swatch ahead of time! Please use 24” or 32” circular needles if you have them. You will need a second 24” circular needle in size 4. If you already have straight needles in the size that gets you gauge, one size smaller and one size larger, that’s OK. However, you will still need the size 4, 24” circular needle.

Class Title: **STITCHES II: TERRIFIC TEXTURES**

Homework/Materials required:

- Several skeins of smooth, light-colored, worsted weight yarn. Try a mixture of yarns: wool, wool blends, cotton, cotton blends, bamboo, silk, alpaca, etc. to see the effect of stitches on many types of yarn. If you have any suitable yarns in your stash, by all means use them. You will be making 16 large swatches; it is difficult to tell you how much yarn you will need.
- Straight or circular needles in a variety of sizes; for some swatches we will be using needles smaller than suggested by the yarn and for others we will be using needles larger than suggested
- Magnetic board (8 X 10) with magnetic ruler (stands are also available) or highlighter tape
- Cable needle
- Your knitting tool kit
- A cushion for your chair

Class Title: **NORWEGIAN MITTENS**

Instructor: Beth Brown-Reinsel

Date and Time: Sunday, December 6 from 10am to 5pm

Homework/Materials required:

- **For Adult Size:** 3 oz each of 2 colors of worsted-weight yarn and one set each of dp needles size 4 for ribbing and size 6 OR 7 for mitten body.
- **For Large Child Size:** 3 oz each of 2 colors of DK weight yarn and one set each of dp needles size 3 for ribbing and size 4 OR 5 for mitten body.
- Your knitting tool kit containing, among other items, a tapestry needle, stitch markers, sticky notes or magnetic board or highlighter tape for reading the charts.
- Your knitting tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.

Homework: The cuff – cast on 40 sts with main color. Join and work k2, p2 ribbing for 10 rounds. Leave on needles, do **not** break yarn. The remainder of the cuff will be worked in class.

Class Title: **BEAD UP YOUR KNITTING**

Homework/Materials required:

- Bead Kit will be provided for a fee of \$10.00. **You must pick this up here at WEBS at least a week before the class so you can do your homework.** See below.
- 50g sport weight yarn (6 sts per inch on size 5 needles). The suggested yarn is Classic Elite Cotton Bam Boo.
- Two straight and two dp needles, size 5.
- Big Eye beading needle (available at WEBS Bead Store)
- **Steel** crochet hook size 8, 9, or 10.
- Tapestry needle.
- Optional: *Knit One Bead Too* by Judith Durant (15% discount)
- Your knitting tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.

HOMEWORK:

Choose your yarn and do a gauge swatch. If you are using the suggested yarn, you should get 6 stitches per inch, no looser. Loose knitters must go down a needle size to get the correct gauge. If the gauge is too loose, the beads will not stay where they belong.

The 808 large cylinder beads should be strung onto your project yarn and pushed down a couple of yards.

Please string the drop and dagger beads onto a 1 yard length of size 8 pearl cotton to match your project yarn in the following order: *1 drop, 1 dagger, 1 drop; repeat from * 13 more times.

Class Title: **PLUG AND PLAY SHAWL DESIGN STARTER CLASS**

Date and Time: Friday, September 25 from 10am to 1pm

Lunch will be served after the class and is included in the tuition.

Homework/Materials required:

- 600-800 yds of fingering-weight yarn – suggestions include wool blended with silk, bamboo or tencel, pure silk, alpaca, cashmere, tencel blends, bamboo. If using multiple skeins, skeins should be the same colorway. Remember that the more variegated your yarn is, the more solid the lace pattern you choose for your shawl will need to be. Tone-on-tone or semi-solids show off lace patterning the best, but if you don't care about this, just bring the yarn you love and we'll make it work.
 - A good selection of needles in sizes 5 – 9 (circulars are great for the increasing row length in triangular shawls), and more sizes wouldn't hurt.
 - A big pile of simple ring stitch markers (at least 25...more is better).
 - A pad of graph paper and a pencil/eraser.

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Class Title: **FELTED YUMMY LUNCH BAG**

Date and Time: Monday, November 2, 16 from 6pm to 8pm

Homework/Materials required:

- Pattern – Noni #410, \$8.30
- Yarn – 4 skeins main color in Cascade 220 or Valley Yarns Northampton, 2 skeins contrast color in Cascade 220 or Valley Yarns Northampton
- Needles – one size 11 circular, one set of size 11 dpns, one size 13 circular
- Various bag hardware will be ordered and available for purchase
- Your knitting tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.

Homework:

- Knit a swatch at least 4”x4” holding yarn double stranded and using size 11 needles. Do not unravel the swatch. Bind off and bring to class. Gauge is 13 sts over 4”.
- Knit bag bottom: C/O 32 sts using a double strand of yarn on size 11 needles. Starting on a K row counted as one, work 49 rows in St st, ending on a K row.
- Row 50 K on the P side for the entire row. Do not bind off. Leave on the needle and bring to class.

Class Title: **COLOR BLOCK CARDIGAN**

- Yarn – Noro Kureyon, Silk Garden; Plymouth Boku or other similarly variegated worsted weight yarns that knit at 4 sts to the inch.
- Yardage – 36” chest – 860 yards; 38” chest – 930 yards; 40” chest – 1020 yards; 42” chest – 1100 yards; 44” chest – 1230 yards; 46” chest – 1270 yards; 48” chest – 1360 yards; 50” chest – 1420 yards; 52” chest – 1490 yards; 54” chest – 1560 yards.
- Needles – straights or 24” circulars in size that obtains the correct gauge (4sts=1”), and needles one or two sizes smaller, depending on how tight you like the ribbing
- Your knitting tool kit.
- A cushion for your chair.

- Yarn: Worsted weight, 800 – 1000 yds Yarn A; 400 – 500 yds Yarn B; 200 – 300 yds Yarn C (edging)
 - Needles: Dpns or 2 circular needles to work well with yarn. Check needle size suggested on the ball band.
 - Your knitting tool kit.
 - A cushion for your chair.

 - Pattern – Magnum Women’s Jacket, #C178
 - Needles – size 15 circular needles (24” or longer); one extra size 15 or a bit larger for the 3-needle bind-off
 - Zipper – one 28” jacket (opens all the way) zipper in a similar color to the jacket. Instructor likes plastic and a little chunky, but that’s just a suggestion. WEBS can give you an Internet address to order the zipper online if you wish.
 - Cotton scrap yarn for stitch holders.
 - Tapestry needle.
 - Sewing needle and thread to match the zipper.

 - Yarn -Finished bust size 35" (750 yds), 37.5" (850 yds), 41" (950 yds), 42" (1050 yds), 44" (1150 yds), 49.5" (1250 yds), 52.5" (1350 yds) of worsted weight 100% wool
 - Needles – size 8 (32") circulars, size 8 dpns or two size 8 circulars to work sleeves in the round, size 10 needle for bind-offs or a needle 1 size larger than used for sweater. Change needle size if necessary to obtain gauge of 4.5 sts per inch.
 - Swatch – Bring a washed and blocked 4" x 4" swatch knit in garter stitch.

- Four (4) skeins of Reynolds Saucy worsted weight cotton yarn in 4 different colors which compliment each other. **No dark colors**, please, as you will be unable to see the stitches.
 - Crochet hooks in sizes F, G, H and I (you may not use them all, but if you are a tight or loose crocheter, you may need to go up or down a size)
 - Your crochet tool kit (scissors, tape measure, Susan Bates Knit check, locking ring markers or safety pins without coils, tapestry needle, pencil or pen)
 - A cushion for your chair
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Class Title: **INTRODUCTION TO BEAD CROCHET, CIRCULAR CROCHET, FINISHING AND BEYOND**

Homework/Materials required:

- Size 4 **Steel** crochet hook
- Bead mat or Workspace
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- A cushion for your chair

For Chain Stitch Necklace: Assorted beads (at least 200 pieces) – this is a great project for leftovers. Beads should be no smaller than a 6/0 seed bead and no larger than 8mm. Side drilled beads (drops, daggers, etc.) work well. You can bring in as many or as few varieties as you like. C-Lon Bead Cord in a coordinating color – you will see a lot of thread in this project.

For Circular Crochet Bracelet: At least 75 4mm crystals in 4 contrasting colors – if your colors are too similar, you will not be able to use them. The more contrast, the better.
